CU-NBT MoU signed

A historic move

By Our Correspondent: The historic Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the University



of Calcutta and National Book Trust (NBT) was signed in presence of Prof. Suranjan Das, Vice Chancellor, Prof. Dhrubajyoti Chattopadhyay, Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Mr. M A Sikandar, Director of NBT on 19 June 2012 at the Syndicate Room of the University. The MoU was signed on behalf of the NBT by Mr. Sikandar and Registrar Prof. Basab Chaudhuri for Calcutta University. Those who signed as witnesses were: Prof. Biplab Chakraborti and Prof. Dhrubaranjan Dandapat, Joint Coordinators, P G Diploma in Book Publishing Studies for the University and Mr. Sumit

Bhattacharjee, Assistant Director and Mr. Sayabur Rehman, Regional Manager (Eastern Regional Office) for the NBT. Among the other dignitaries present were: Prof. S N Bera Director, Centre for Studies in Book Publishing (CSBP); Mr. Tridib Chatterjee, Hony. General Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Kolkata; Mr. Sudhangshu Dey, President, Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Kolkata and Mr. Raju Barman, Joint Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild, Kolkata.

CSBP, the first of its kind in India offers the PGDBPS, a one-year full time evening course covering every aspect of book publishing. The syllabus caters to the industry demands by generating well-trained, market-ready professionals every year, who have appropriate academic competence, adequate skill and attitude to handle different areas of publishing, editing, production, design and marketing.

The MoU mentions that from now onwards the NBT would bear the cost of honorarium for the resource persons/ guest faculties, cooperate in providing the students with facilities for internship/hands-on training, bear the cost of preparation and printing of study materials, etc. Besides providing infrastructure facilities, the NBT would also attempt its best to publicize the course. Short-term training programmes on various specialized aspects of book publishing would also be sponsored.

With the collaboration of NBT as a new partner, opportunities would be opened for the students of this course. This attempt would immensely benefit the book publishing community too. NBT, established in 1957, is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Being a highly professional multilingual publishing house, its role is to play as the nodal body for the promotion of

Indian books and for the dissemination of book culture in India. At the end of the programme, Prof. Suranjan Das, Vice Chancellor, Mr. M A Sikandar and Mr. Tridib Kumar Chatterjee attended a press conference at the same venue.

Prof. Das expressed his desire that the MoU would strengthen the postgraduate diploma course in book publishing studies. "We may think of starting a full-time course if we get such assistance. We will write to the state government too for similar assistance so that we may make this course popular which will help the publishing sector", he said. "The course would be tailor made to suit the requirements of the industry. We will have both english and bengali curriculum that would prepare young editors to take on the job at the end of the course. Apart from the university faculty, we could also have publishers to help take classes. We would also involve publishers in framing the curricula," said the CU Vice Chancellor.

Meeting with the Director, NBT

After the end of the press conference, an impromptu meeting was held at the Syndicate Room to apprise the NBT officials regarding the PGDBP course. The meeting was attended by Mr. M A Sikandar, Director, NBT; Prof S N Bera, Director, CSBP; Prof Biplab Chakraborti, Joint Coordinator, P G Diploma in Book Publishing Studies (PGDBPS); Mr. Sumit Bhattacharjee, Assistant Director, NBT; Mr. Tridib Chatterjee, Hony. General Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild; Mr. Sudhangshu Dey, President, Publishers & Booksellers Guild; Mr. Sayabur Rehman, Regional Manager, Eastern Region, NBT and Mr. Raju Barman, Joint Secretary, Publishers & Booksellers Guild. The meeting was chaired by Prof Biplab Chakraborti.

The NBT Director was briefed about the ongoing curriculum and academic activities of the CSBP by Prof S N Bera and Prof Biplab Chakraborti. Mr. Sikandar expressed his satisfaction over the present curricular programme after he was given the syllabus of the PGDBPS. He also informed that his observation on the present syllabus would be communicated at the earliest. It was announced that short-term training courses, workshops, seminars,

etc. would be jointly organized in due course of time. Prof. S N Bera, Prof Biplab Chakraborti thanked the Director of NBT for his cooperation.

TRANSLATOR'S ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

For the second consecutive year, the Department of Linguistics, University of Calcutta, held the Translators' Orientation Programme in Bangla. The programme was organized by the National Translation Mission, CIIL, Mysore in collaboration with the Department of Linguistics, University of Calcutta from 8 to 10 February 2012. English is the primary medium of higher education in India which often remains inaccessible to the mass educated till the secondary and higher secondary level in one of the vernaculars. This leads to the violation of the right to free, fair and equal education for all. National Translation Mission (NTM) is a Government of India initiative to make knowledge texts accessible in all the languages listed in the 8th schedule of the Constitution, by means of translation.

Translation is of course the door to knowledge by cutting down the barrier of unintelligibility of the medium. All of us are more or less acquainted with translation either directly or indirectly in our day-to-day activities as we live in a multilingual society. However, the translation of knowledge texts requires skills and orientation, which are quite different from other much-translated areas like literature and media. This orientation programme gave all the participants an insight into the different aspects of translation. Eminent scholars and experts in various fields pointed out the major problem areas in their respective fields, which in a way, motivated aspiring translators to identify those and contribute to solutions.

Mr. Debajit Sharma and Ms. Dipabali Roy were the two representatives of NTM who introduced the participants to the aims and objectives of NTM and also made them aware of the scope and opportunities in translation activities, the by-product of which being empowerment of Indian languages and speech communities. The workshop also gave the participants a firsthand experience in translating an English text on Early Indian History into Bangla, which were evaluated by the experts. They also

advised the participants to improve their translation skills and the 'better' translations were rewarded.

The workshop had six sessions including the inaugural session. The welcome address was delivered by Prof. Mina Dan, Head of the Department of Linguistics, Calcutta University and the inaugural address by Prof. Sanjukta Dasgupta, Dean of Arts, Calcutta University. Prof. Probal Dasgupta (Indian Statistical Institute, Kolkata) was chaired as the Chief Guest. Prof. Krishna Bhattacharva (Department of Linguistics, CU) delivered the key-note address, Prof. Satyajit Layek, Head of the Department, Sanskrit, Calcutta University; Prof. Rajashri Shukla, Head of the Department, Hindi; Calcutta University and Prof. Sucharita Bandhopadhaya, Head of the Department, Bengali, CU delivered their speeches, while representing various academic bodies.

The first orientation session had the introductory lecture on knowledge text translation delivered by Prof. Probal Dasgupta while Prof. Krishna Bhattacharya specified on issues related to translation into Bengali and machine translation. A new approach to translation was introduced by Dr. Niladri Sekhar Dash, Assistant Professor, LRU, ISI, Kolkata.

The second and third orientation sessions had lectures from professors of linguistics. Prof. Mahidas Bhattacharya of Jadavpur University spoke on problems and challenges of translation (Linguistics), Prof. Mina Dan spoke on translation and terminology; Dr. Aditi Ghosh, Assistant Professor, Department of Linguistics, CU spoke on translation strategy and knowledge text translation. Ms. Baidehi Sengupta, a professional translator in media concentrated on translation in the field of media.

The valedictory session was an interesting one which had the presence of scholars like Prof. Syamal Chakrabarti (Chemistry-CU), Prof. Samir Bandyopadhyay (Zoology-CU) and Prof. Bula Bhadra (Sociology-CU), who placed the problems and challenges of translation in the respective fields to the participants and motivated them for possible solutions. Each participant was given a certificate

and a travelling allowance during the valedictory session, presided over by Prof. Mina Dan, Head, Department of Linguistics, University of Calcutta.

After the discussion was over, an hour-long interactive session was organized to facilitate CSBP students and booklovers to interact with the publishers from North-East India.

PRESS INTERNSHIP

The CSBP, University of Calcutta in association with Sarat Impressions Pvt. Ltd., Kolkata conducted a 6-day unique press internship programme at the production unit of the printing house located at Gadmirjapur, Andul, Howrah for the diploma students (Session 2011 - 12). The objective was to impart practical training on book production and allow these students to have hands on experience on printing as well as book production. The internship programme was scheduled from 9 May to 15 May 2012 with a break on Sunday (13 May 2012). The students came to know of every detail of 'imposition (arrangement of pages in the form)' and 'colour imposition', gathered thorough knowledge of 'plate-making' and experienced detailed operation of 'offset printing machine'. The students were taught with care the process of folding (called bhajai in local term) large printed papers so as to convert to an 8, 16, 32 or 64-page signatures and gathering different folded signatures (called michiltola in local term) that results in all pages of a book being in numerical order, the procedure of sewing these gathered signatures as well. The students also learned the method of trimming papers in desired size both automatically with programmed measurement and manually. Another interesting area was binding. The students took much interest in gaining knowledge of 'perfect binding' and 'casing in' of a book. Besides, getting an idea and developing a concept as regards to quality of papers having different GSM value and varied size of books is a worth addition to the students' knowledge.

The press internship programme was coordinated by Alekhya Bhattacharya, resource person of the course.
