All members of University of Calcutta deeply mourn the untimely death of their celebrated Professor of Economics, Shri Sarbajit Chaudhuri, in a Chennai hospital today on 25th April, 2021. Aged 56 years, Prof Chaudhuri held Bachelors' and Masters' degrees from University of Calcutta and PhD from Jadavpur University. He started his career as a lecturer in West Bengal Education Services and then joined Department of

both B.Sc examination in Psychology, and M.Sc examination in Applied Psychology at the University of Calcutta. She obtained her PhD degree in Applied Psychology from the University of Calcutta in 1981. Subsequently, she worked as Post Doctoral Research Fellow at the Indian Institute of Management, Calcutta from 1981 to 1983. She joined Vijay Krishna Girls' College, Howrah in 1983 as Lecturer. In 1985, she joined the Department of Applied Psychology, University of Calcutta, as Lecturer, and retired from the same Department as Professor in 2016. Her diverse research interests encompassed Psychology of Advertisement and Consumer Psychology, Interpersonal communication, Interpersonal relationships, Organizational Psychology, Positive

subsequently pursuing his education in Calcutta. He obtained his BA in Political Science from Presidency College, his MA and PhD from the University of Calcutta before joining Seth Anandaram Jaipuria College in 1958 as a lecturer. Having served there for fourteen years, he took up a post as reader at the University of Burdwan in 1972. Eventually, he joined the Department of Political Science at the University of Calcutta in 1977 and continued to teach here until his retirement in 1999.

Prof. Choudhuri specialised in Marxist philosophy, and focused on the machinery of the Calcutta corporation administration in his doctoral thesis. He further undertook research in the field of urban governance as a British Council Scholar at the University of Birmingham. Apart

and researcher in the field of Neuroscience. His work on muscle relaxant bisbenzylisoquinoline of Menispermaceous plants of India, Neurotoxins of Indian Marine Poisonous Fishes, Plant Drugs used in Neurodegenerative Diseases, Anti-diabetic and Wound healing drugs from plants and Ayurvedic Metal Preparations earned world-wide recognition as reflected in his more than one hundred forty publications in peer-reviewed journals of international repute, three Indian patents, editing books, contribution of many book chapters, earning national and international research funding, including IFS (Sweden) and in the production of several Ph.D.s in various disciplines including chemistry. He was awarded 'Gold Medal'; being distinguished scholar for delivering the prestigious *Dr. B.N. Ghosh Memorial Oration* of the University of Calcutta. He was a Fellow of the *West Bengal Academy of Science and Technology*, Member of '*Phytochemical Society of Asia*,

the University of Calcutta in the year 1979 and after that received his Ph.D. from the same University. Initially he taught in the Department of Statistics, Burdwan University for about 28 years and then joined the Department of Statistics, University of Calcutta as a full Professor in the year 2009. His contributions in the areas of Reliability, Biostatistics and Statistical Data Analysis will be remembered with admiration. Besides his brilliance in academics, Professor Chattopadhyay was the Secretary of Calcutta Statistical Association, a premier organisation for promoting the study of Statistics, for more than a decade. Recently he became one of the Editors of the Sage published journal "Calcutta Statistical Association Bulletin". Professor Chattopadhyay was a great teacher, who was loved and admired by

Economics, University of Calcutta in 1997. A globally recognised scholar of Labour Economics and Development Economics, he has authored nearly 100 research papers in top global journals and four books with publishers like Springer and Routledge. Prof Chaudhuri currently commands an enviable H-Index score of 24 with more than 2020 citations of his works. His involvement with the in-house Departmental journal *Arthaniti*, now *Arthaniti-Journal of Economic Theory and Practice* (Sage), goes back to almost a quarter of century and he was the Chief Editor of the journal since 2015. His relentless efforts were instrumental in getting this journal a global recognition when the famous publishing house took over for its marketing and distribution. Professor Chaudhuri was suffering

Psychology, and Counseling Psychology. She was also interested in rehabilitation of differently challenged children as well as drug-addicts, and undertook major projects in these areas. She had further contributed to the domain of Applied Psychology by developing various measures and tools for assessment of psychological variables. She had also served as the member of Senate of the University of Calcutta from 2007 to 2014.

Professor Mukherjee holds a very special place in the heart of the students, research scholars and colleagues owing to her impeccable sweet demeanor and calm and polite disposition. Her beautiful smile and affectionate gestures were disarming. Professor Mukherjee will always be remembered as a devoted teacher, a kind

He was instrumental in preparing a documentary and a book on Acharya P. C. Ray, the Father of Chemistry Teaching and Research in India under the aegis of this organisation. His students, friends and colleagues established in India and abroad will always miss

his students. He was always involved in the activities of the department, and contributed much to its progress. He shared a very close relation with all his colleagues. His students, friends and colleagues will always miss him as a successful researcher, kind mentor and an excellent human being.
